

ANGLO SAXONS MEET THE VIKINGS

It's the late 9th century, and the Vikings have travelled by longboat along the Great River Ouse. On the Danelaw/Wessex boundary, they find the Anglo-Saxon village at Chellington. Dressed and prepared, the children re-enact a battle, based on the old English poem 'The Battle of Maldon'. Will the Viking raiders be victorious? Or will the Anglo-Saxons protect Chellington?



Make a Helmet

The children become either Vikings or Anglo-Saxons and make their own helmets based upon historical and archaeological evidence.

Decorate a Shield

Children decorate their shields using inspiration from historical research into Anglo-Saxon or Viking designs.

Warrior Training

Out in the field, children are introduced to the cries, commands and team work required to succeed in battle. The children complete their preparations and practise their formations and strategy.

Battle Re-Enactment

The group, wearing helmets they have made, shields they have decorated and foam weapons, visit the site and re-enact battle!



SAMPLE ITINERARY

This is an example of a bespoke 24 hour itinerary, designed with the help of our programme manager

DAY 1

12:00 - 13:00 Class arrives, unloads and has packed lunch under trees (brought from home)

13:00 - 13:30 Class introduction to Anglo-Saxons & Vikings

13:30 - 14:30 Free time to explore outside, team building games (games field)

14:30 - 16:30 Anglo-Saxon and Viking helmet making and shield decoration

16:30 - 17:45 Make and cook pizza from scratch

17:45 - 18:30 Eat dinner

18:30 - 19:15 Wash up and free time

19:15 - 20:45 Anglo-Saxon & Viking warrior training

20:45 - 21:15 Campfire

21:15 - 21:45 Get ready for bed in bunk rooms

21:45 Lights out

DAY 2

07:00 - 07:45 Wake up, pack rooms and remove belongings to outside

07:45 - 08:30 Breakfast

08:30 - 09:30 Make packed lunch & break

9:30 - 12:00 Battle re-enactment (river pasture or games field)

12:00 - 12:30 Class departs

ENJOY TIME IN & OUTDOORS

All our amazing spaces, both inside the main building and in the surrounding area, have been designed with maximum flexibility in mind for games, educational activities or for the children to simply enjoy their freedom.

The main hall provides a wonderful focal point for your group to enjoy. The dramatic, high timbered ceiling creates great acoustics for musical events and the steps to the chancel form a natural stage.

For many children, time around the campfire and BBQ is the highlight of their trip. It's time to talk, sing, and tell stories together with hot chocolate and toasted marshmallows. The adjacent games field with no public access is a stunning setting to enjoy a multitude of activities as well as overflow camping for larger school groups.





BREAKOUT

Two more great activity spaces

With its spectacular semi-circular wall of windows, the inspiring Ibbett Room brings 180° of sky and countryside into the Centre and offers stunning panoramic views over the Ouse Valley and lakes in the country park below.

Children love spending time in the Winne Hall Room - a great space for study, drama, music, teaching, presentations, buffet set-up at meal times, playing board games or just chatting and chilling. This room can also be used as a bedroom for 6 people.





EATING

Our fully equipped modern kitchen has everything you need for self-catering for up to 72. The hatch to the main hall makes it easy for children to help.

We welcome groups of all sizes. Big or small, each group enjoys sole use of the entire site. Up to 36 can sleep in our bunkrooms with the option to add a further 36 camping.

There are 5 separate shower cubicles and 7 toilets in the main building plus the option to use a further 4 shower cubicles and toilets in washrooms in our new Herald Building (includes an accessible shower/toilet in both buildings).



OUR COMMITMENT TO THE ENVIRONMENT

This is an ancient site. Communities have existed in harmony here since the bronze age with local sheep farming, leatherwork, lacework and reed-weaving - all important medieval industries. As custodians, we have made a commitment to share knowledge, engage and lead in caring for our environment. This is particularly important to us as we work with young people whose future will be impacted by how we operate.

We are proud to have achieved Silver Award certification from Green Tourism in recognition of our extensive work in developing a

sustainable, biodiverse Centre in direct response to our commitment to young people, our community and the planet.



Green Education

Our ongoing initiatives include: nature walks, nature identification boards, re-wilding activity (tree and hedgerow planting, wildflower bridging), socio-historical quizzes, binocular bird-spotting, star-gazing, eco-signage tips and on-site forest school activities.



Energy Use

Our electricity source is 100% renewable energy (hydro and wind). We have an efficient eco-air-source system for all our (underfloor) heating and hot water needs. Double glazed windows and insulation minimise heat loss, making it comfortable and sustainable for year-round accommodation.



Lighting

90% of our lighting is now flexibly controlled, low consumption LED.



Local Food Sourcing

We encourage you to support our village shop and local farms if you can. They will deliver boxes of fresh groceries with only a few days' notice.



Drinking Water

Our Bedfordshire water is lovely from the tap.




Recycling & Waste

We have ongoing initiatives to source ecological and recycled products. We have drastically reduced the amount of land-fill waste and recycling we produce and are committed to working with you and our local partners to do more.



Single-Use

We strongly discourage the use of single-use cutlery, plates, bowls, cups or plastic water bottles.

BURSARY FUND

We believe that every young person should have the opportunity to have a life changing residential experience.
